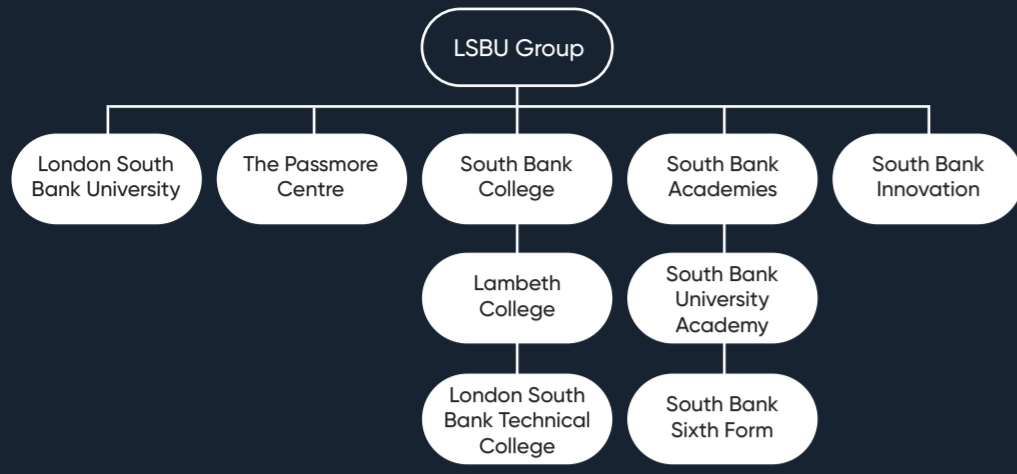

The Need for Arts Roles

There's never been a better time to pursue a career in the creative arts. Around 42% of employers in the creative industries - including 73% of those taking on more than 100 people - admitted they had skills issues. This had led to a governmental partnership with the Creative Industries Council, which has set out plans for the sector well into the next decade, as it seeks to address issues such as creative skills gaps, the impact of artificial intelligence (AI), and ensuring that people from all backgrounds can access the creative industries.

Creative arts' career opportunities are available in areas as diverse as advertising and marketing, crafts, all mediums of design, fashion, film, TV, video, theatre, radio, photography, games, computer services, publishing, museums, galleries, libraries, music, performing and visual arts. Wherever your creative and artistic passions may lay, you're sure to find a pathway to match your ambitions.

Around 300,000 UK businesses are part of the Creative Industries. Of all creative businesses, 34% are located in London

72% of the creative workforce are highly qualified: hold a degree/ higher level qualification Level 4 or above, compared with 45% for the whole economy.

The film, television, and video sectors contributed nearly £13 billion to the UK economy, representing an increase of 35% since 2014.

The UK film industry is concentrated in London and the Southeast, where over half of all production occurs.

Recent rapid growth within the UK production sector is leading to increasing crew shortages. Forecasted growth shows that a further 15,130 - 20,770 full-time employees will be needed by 2025

An Introduction to The Arts

When you say "the arts", many people will think of film, television, and the stage; but the world of the creative and performing arts is so much more than that. From costume design to dancing, ceramics to stage management, right through to producing and photography, the creative arts are all around us, and they offer an array of exciting, varied, and inspiring careers. With multiple pathways in art and design, acting, dance, performing and production arts, photography, fine art curation and fashion, your future could be as wild as your imagination.

Is The Arts the Right Pathway for You?

Gaining the necessary qualifications, and undertaking placements, can teach you the knowledge and expertise you will need in this sector, but there are a number of personal qualities and transferable skills that are essential for a successful and rewarding career in The Arts sector. With such a wide variety of roles available the exact skills you'll need will depend upon your chosen pathway, but most roles will require a mix of skills:

You'll need excellent written and verbal communication skills; great interpersonal skills, including persuasiveness, patience, tact, and understanding; possess a high-level of creativity and artistic flair; the ability to produce and communicate fresh ideas and innovative concepts; be confident in your decision making; have a flexible approach and be able to accept rejection and criticism; have the capacity to deal with stress, and work well under pressure; be passionate about your chosen medium and keep up to date with industry trends and developments; have excellent organisational skills and the ability to prioritise and multi-task; be thorough in your work and always pay attention to detail; be equally effective working as part of a team, or under your own initiative; possess strong technical knowledge and skills; have high levels of motivation, perseverance, and self-confidence; and be comfortable in the use of technology, including computers and hand-held devices.

Careers in The Arts

The UK has an estimated 2.29m creative jobs, and the arts sector is a wide and wonderful world of opportunity. The sector has around 1.62m permanent roles, and a further 663,000 self-employed creative industry jobs. Key parts of these creative industries are Film, TV, video, radio and photography (239,000 employees), Music, performing and visual arts (315,000 employees).

There are a large number of performing arts and art & design careers that are accessible to you, with many roles valuing creativity and real-world experience just as highly as advanced qualifications, and many highly-technical sectors require a university degree.

Fantastic opportunities await those with the requisite skills and personal qualities. You can progress within your chosen career path by gaining real-world, hands-on experience as well as achieving sought-after, higher-level qualifications. If you are looking for a career in the performance or broadcast arts, putting together a portfolio of your work is advised. This can be done via digital mediums, and social media, including blogs, vlogs, podcasts, and video, and can be particularly useful in securing a valued role.

Starting salaries for **Arts Administrators** range from £16k to £20k, with experienced arts administrators earning up to £30k. **Senior management or chief executives** can earn in excess of £60k per year. **Costume Designer** salaries can be around £35k. **Weekly pay rates for theatre Dancers** vary depending on the scale and location of the production, and can be anything from £500 to £900 per week, while dancers in films earnings often range between £900 and £2,500 per week. **Floor Managers** very often work on a freelance basis. Day rates can range from around £120 to £400, while permanent positions start at around £21k per year, rising to £45k for senior television floor manager roles. **Museum and Gallery Curator** salaries start at around £18k to £25k as assistants, increasing to £26k to £35k with experience, while salaries at senior level - such as lead curator or head of collections - can exceed £40k per year. **Starting salaries for Assistant Producers** may range from around £18k to £25k per year, but with experience, **Producer** salaries can reach £40k to £55k, and departmental heads can earn £60k to £80k p.a.

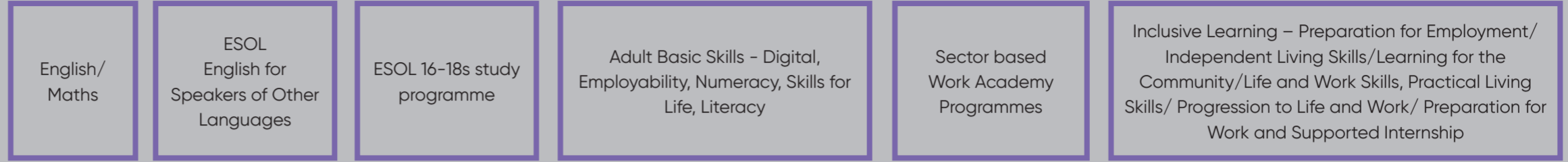

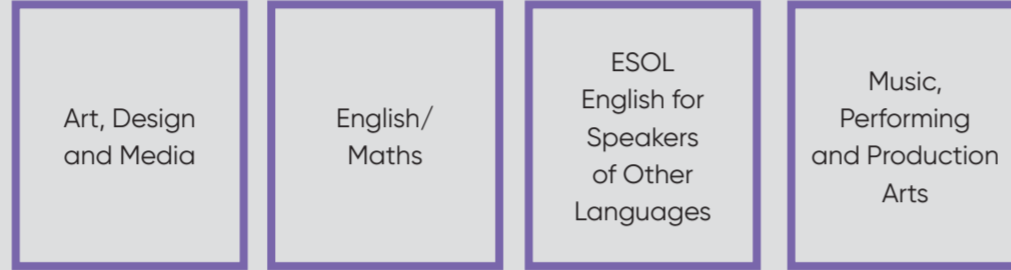

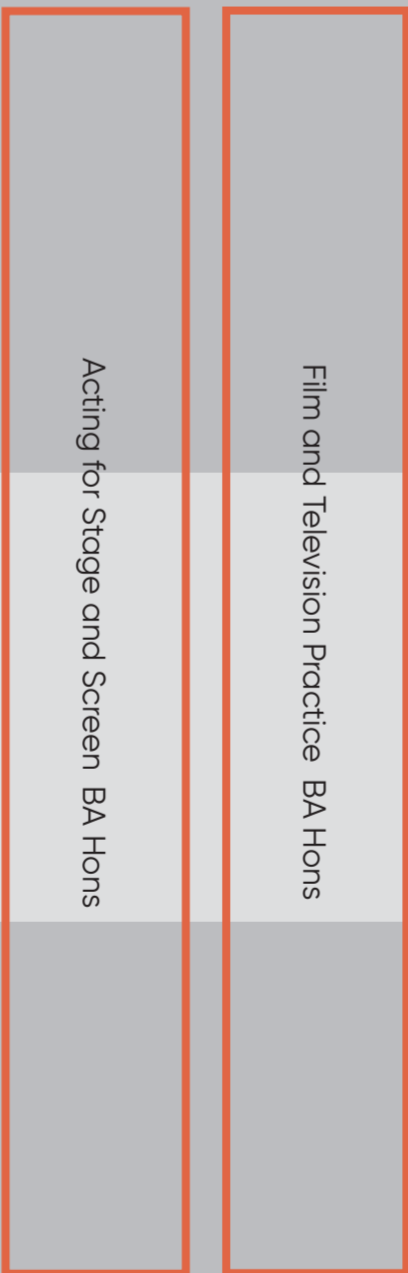
